

Cambridge Scholars Publishing Contributor Copies Policy

A substantial proportion of the titles brought out every year by Cambridge Scholars Publishing (hereafter CSP) are multi-contributor, edited volumes. With very few exceptions, however, CSP's agreement is with the editors of the volume and not with individual contributors who in general make agreements with the editors that only indirectly relate to CSP. In order to avoid any confusion the present document is intended as a clarification of CSP's contributor copy policies.

1. For all fully subsidised books, each contributor receives 15 complimentary copies. For all books that are partially subsidised, individual agreements and the extent of the subsidy determines the number of complimentary copies.

The following points refer to non-subsidised books:

2. For multi-authored books that are not edited by individuals other than their authors, the complimentary copy agreement depends on the number of authors and the nature of the book. Contracts are prepared based on the individual needs of the volume in question.

3. For edited volumes with 12 or fewer contributors (including editors) excluding conference proceedings, CSP in general offers one book per contributor including editors. The agreement for the exact number as well as delivery, however, is made with the editor(s) and CSP does not ship books directly to individual contributors.

4. For edited volumes with over 12 contributors, excluding conference proceedings, CSP usually but not necessarily offers a total of 12 complimentary copies deliverable to the editors.

5. For conference proceedings, CSP offers an agreed number of complimentary copies to the editors and does not at this time provide for individual contributor copies.

6. All contributors, however, automatically receive a substantial discount for all CSP publications and these discounts are the same as those received by editors and authors of singly or jointly authored works.

All contributors should clarify the status of any complimentary copies for which they may be eligible with their editors prior to submission of their contributions in multi-volume works.
